The key to a successful fire service operation is the trained supervisor. This course starts to develop the skills the leaders of today and tomorrow need to ensure personal and organizational success both on the emergency scene and in the fire station.

Outline: This 6 Day, 40 Hour training course is for supervisory officers and covers effectively managing emergency scene operations, supervising personnel, and communicating with the public. This program will be presented by Barnstable County Fire Rescue Training Academy staff, Fire Chiefs and IAFF Master Trainer and Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada Fire Officer Lionel Crowther

Book: Fire and Emergency Services Company Officer 5th edition by IFSTA.

Objective: The Company Officer I course meets or exceeds the job performance requirements in the NFPA Standard 1021 Fire Officer Professional Qualifications for Fire Officer I. This course will prepare the attendee for the Fire Officer I certification exam.

This course is a priority selection course. There are no prerequisites for this course.

Pro Board certification and MFA Certification Requirements for Company Officer One Exam:

All Firefighters must be certified to the level of Firefighter II (Firefighter II or Firefighter I/II) and Fire Instructor I by the Massachusetts Fire Training Council OR received reciprocal credit from either the National Board on Fire Service Professional Qualifications, Inc. OR the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress.

Fire Officers appointed to the officer rank of Lieutenant, Captain, or any Chief Officer on or after January 1, 1995 and serving in that officer rank at the time of application must be certified to the level of Firefighter II (Firefighter II or Firefighter I/II) and Fire Instructor I by the Massachusetts Fire Training Council OR received reciprocal credit from either the National Board on Fire Service Professional Qualifications, Inc. OR the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress.

Fire Officers appointed to the officer rank of Lieutenant, Captain, or any Chief Officer prior to January 1, 1995 and serving in that officer rank at the time of application must submit the "Fire Officer Prerequisite" form completed by the Chief of Department. Exam must be submitted in a timely manner.
